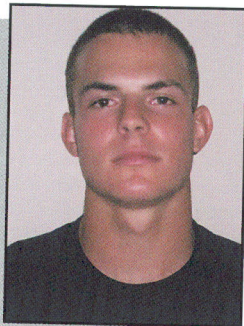


WEST ALL-AMERICANS



2 RYAN ADAMS

Height: 6-0 ■ Weight: 185 ■ Position: SS
Jesuit HS ■ Mandeville, LA

Ryan is a versatile middle infielder who is quick in the hole and fast on the basepaths. He can run a 6.6 60 and routinely throws in the upper 80s from his shortstop position. Ryan helped lead his Jesuit HS team to one of the best seasons in the school's history. Ryan batted .465 with 39 RBIs, five home runs, three triples and 17 doubles. The team went 34-5, won the 5A State Championship and finished the season ranked 14th in Baseball America's national poll. Ryan was named to the All-Metro and All-State Teams.

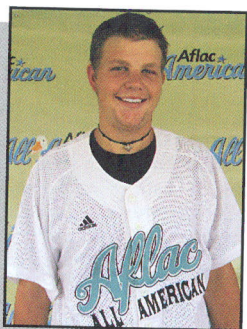
11 ROBBY ALCOMBRACK

Robby Alcombrack is one of the top catching prospects in the class of 2006. Robby has a solid frame, durable build and strong hands. He is energetic behind the plate and his short and accurate release is one of the reasons he is a top prospect. Robby is also a terror when stepping up to the plate. Each of the past three seasons Robby has batted over .400 for Bear River High School. Robby has also been a part of two AAU National Championship teams when he was 15 and 17.

6 BRETT ANDERSON

Height: 6-4 ■ Weight: 205 ■ Position: LHP
Stillwater HS ■ Stillwater, OK

The West's answer to Kasey Kiker, Anderson is bigger than the top lefthander for the East, but both pitchers possess an advanced feel for pitching and the ability to command all three of their pitches. Brett garnered All-State honors as a junior at Stillwater High, compiling a 5-1 record with five saves, an 0.68 ERA, 62 strikeouts and a walk. He was one of six players on this year's Aflac roster to be named as a finalist for the 2005 USA Baseball junior national team, thanks in part to his strong showing at the Tournament of Stars in Joplin, Mo., in June of 2005. Brett played an integral part in USA Baseball's youth national team's silver-medal winning performance at the 2004 Pan-Am Championship Qualifier in Lagos De Moreno, Mexico. He tied event record with 24 strikeouts in two appearances, earning wins against Argentina and Mexico. Brett went 9-1 with a 1.14 ERA as a sophomore at Stillwater High, registering 102 strikeouts and 14 walks. He is ranked No. 1 academically in his class as a freshman and sophomore. Brett is the son of Oklahoma State head coach Frank Anderson and former college softball standout Sandra Anderson.

22 NATHAN BRIDGES

Height: 6-1 ■ Weight: 170 ■ Position: SS
Villa Park HS ■ Yorba Linda, CA

Nathan is a versatile shortstop who has an exceptionally strong arm. He is a good hitter that projects to be a third baseman. Nathan has excellent hands and reaction time. Last season as a sophomore Nathan made the All-CIF Southern Section Division II second team as he batted .367 with 10 home runs. As a junior Nathan was selected First Team All League and made the National Classic All-Tournament Team as his Villa Park High School team won the highly regarded tournament. This summer Nathan was selected to attend the USA tryouts in Joplin, Missouri.
